	<b>November 2018-February 2019</b> - Preparing CSO written submissions to the OEIGWG on priority proposals for the text of the Draft Treaty - from each country in the identified countries (above) in Asia and Europe.
	<b>March to September 2019</b> – Organise Public Forums towards developing a broad public awareness on the ongoing work on the Treaty on TNCs and Human Rights geared towards affected communities – and highlighting how the Treaty can make a difference in regulating the operations of TNCs.
	Engage directly with Governments and Parliament on the content of the Draft Treaty towards mobilising a strong participation of governments to bring robust content for the Treaty debate in October 2019.
